ST. MARY'S ENDOWMENT FUND

In 1986 an educational endowment was set up for St. Mary's School. The purpose of St. Mary's Grade School Endowment Fund is to invest funds in which the proceeds of those investments go to support the ministry of St. Mary's School. Funds are invested with financial institutions. Today the total amount of funds invested is close to \$1.1 million. A separate endowment advisory board oversees the investment and recommends disbursements. Information about the endowment will be sent out later this month.

Cut calories by drinking water or unsweetened beverages. Soda, energy drinks, and sports drinks are a major source of added sugar, and calories, in American diets.


After School Pickup



"St. Mary's Prioritizes Social Emotional Training With Its Staff"

This school year we are placing focus on the well-being of our students. According to the CDC, mental health includes children's mental, emotional, and behavioral well-being. It affects how children think, feel, and act. It also plays a role in how children handle stress, relate to others, and make healthy choices. This year we have had a series of training related to mental health, trauma, and the neurodivergent learner. Through these training sessions we have also placed an emphasis on making sure our staff's needs are being met so that they are at their very best and feel supported in the classroom. In order to best meet the needs of our students and staff, our staff has participated in the following training:

The Neurodivergent Learner:

This training presented teachers with information on the diverse learners that are in their classrooms along with how best to provide those students with equitable learning opportunities.

Youth Mental Health First Aid:

This training was provided by Central Kansas Mental Health and provided teachers the knowledge and skills on identifying a mental health crisis and how to handle a mental health crisis within the school setting.

Recognizing Trauma in the School Setting:

This trauma informed training provided insight into what trauma is and how it affects the brain. Our teachers learned that relationships and classroom environments have a strong impact on the learning and emotional success of our students.





Taking a closer look at the number is also an enjoyable insight into the minds of our young readers. I thought you might also like to hear a bit from our Top 20 Circulated Titles List for this year so here are a few fun facts that I learned from our checkout report:

The #1 Picture Book - Don't let the Pigeon Stay Up Late by Mo Willems

Pigeon is one of my favorite picture book characters. A scoop of attitude, a huge helping of silly, and you've got a great character for readers young and old.

The #1 Fiction Book - Refugee by Alan Gratz

Telling the story of three different refugees from three different events in history (Nazi Germany in 1939, Cuba in 1994, and Syria in 2015), Gratz weaves a powerful story of their journey and struggle.

The #1 Series - I Survived... (fill in the blank) by Lauren Tarshis

An approachable take on historical fiction. Telling stories from the eyes of fictional characters set in real-world events and based on facts found through the author's research. A new lens to see events in history

The #1 Nonfiction Subject - Football

Our students look right past the faded covers with heroes of yesteryear and are pleased as punch to find something from the sport they love. This section is getting an update with new materials, but even without them, it makes a strong showing in the Top 20.

I look forward to seeing what the second half looks like. If our current champions stay on the top of the shelf or if some new up-and-coming books take the top spots in 2023. We will just have to wait and keep on reading!
